INFORMATION CLAUSE ON THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA OF PIPC MEMBERS'
REPRESENTATIVES

In connection with the provisions of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (Text with EEA relevance) (hereinafter referred to as the "GDPR"), we would like to inform you how we will process your, or yours' representatives in the Polish Chamber of the Chemical Industry, data and what powers you have in this respect.

Please read the information below. Who is the administrator (controller) of your personal data?

The administrator of your personal data is the Polish Chamber of the Chemical Industry (hereinafter referred to as the "PIPC" or "Chamber") with its registered office in 00-654 Warszawa, Śniadeckich 17, entered into the register of associations, other social and trade organizations, foundations and public health care institutions and the register of entrepreneurs of the National Court Register kept by the District Court for the Capital City of Warszawa in Warszawa, XII Commercial Department of the National Court Register under the number KRS 0000015704.

What is the purpose and grounds for processing your personal data?

Your personal data will be processed by PIPC to carry out tasks resulting from legitimate interests pursued by the Chamber. This will concern in particular:

- (a) acceptance as a member of PIPC and enabling the execution of the rights and obligations of a Chamber member through a representative, in particular the rights and obligations arising from the PIPC Statute;
- (b) prevention of fraud;
- (c) statistical purposes;
- (d) determination, investigation or defence against claims; and
- (e) ensure accountability (demonstrating PIPC's compliance with the legal provisions).

The basis for the processing of your personal data in the cases described above will be Article 6(1)(f) of GDPR.

In the absence of other indications, your personal data will be processed based on your voluntary consent. The basis for the processing of your personal data in this case will be Article 6(1)(a) of GDPR. In case of data processing based on your consent, you may withdraw it at any time. However, this will not affect the lawfulness of the previously performed processing.

Who did we collect your personal data from? Is it mandatory to provide such data?

We have collected your personal data directly from you or a member of the PIPC, of which you are a representative.

Membership in PIPC and the exercise of the rights and obligations of a Chamber member, in particular those arising from the Statute of PIPC requires processing your personal data in the form of your name, surname, name of your current place of employment, position, e-mail address and telephone number.



How long will we keep your personal data?

The time for which your personal data will be processed and stored depends on the legal basis on which the processing will be performed. In any case, the data will be kept by PIPC for the period necessary to achieve the purposes of the processing. Your personal data will be processed during the entire period of your, or the entity you are representing, membership in PIPC, as well as for 10 years after its termination, in order to pursue the legitimate PIPC's interests and objectives, including the prevention of fraud, the determination, investigation or defence against claims and to ensure accountability (to demonstrate PIPC's compliance with the legal provisions).

In case of data processed based on your consent, they will be deleted as soon as it will be revoked.

Do we share your data with third parties?

Your personal data may be disclosed to other entities to the extent necessary for the proper performance of PIPC's statutory tasks and the exercise of rights and obligations of the Chamber member. This applies in particular to domestic and foreign organisations, and in particular to federations and confederations of employers and chemical industry organisations of which PIPC is a member.

Your personal data may also be disclosed to entities authorised by law, in particular public authorities.

To other third parties, your data may be disclosed if you will give a separate consent only.

Your personal data may be transferred to data processing entities acting on behalf of PIPC (hereinafter referred to as the "processing entities"), where such entities will process your data based on an agreement concluded with the Chamber, and the transfer of such data will be subject to security measures and control by PIPC.

Do we transfer your personal data to third countries or international organisations?

Your personal data may be transferred by PIPC outside the European Economic Area or to foreign organisations of which PIPC is a member to the extent necessary for the proper performance of PIPC's statutory tasks and the exercise of rights and obligations of a PIPC member.

Data may be transferred to third countries only if the requirements provided for in Article 44 et seq. of GDPR will be met.

What rights do you have with respect to your personal data?

You have the right to access and correct the content of your data, the right to request deletion or restriction in its processing, the right to withdraw your consent at any time (without affecting the lawfulness of the processing that has been carried out based on your consent prior to its withdrawal), the right to object the processing of your data, as well as the right to transfer your data - in cases and to the extent detailed in GDPR provisions.

Right to object.

You have the right to object the processing of your personal data - for reasons related to your specific situation - when the processing is carried out due to the legitimate interests of PIPC. In such a case, PIPC will cease to process your data for these purposes unless the Chamber will be able to demonstrate that there are valid and legally binding grounds for such processing which take precedence over your interests, rights and freedoms, or that



processing of your data will be necessary for us to determine, investigate or defend against claims.

Right of complaint to the supervisory authority.

If you believe that your personal data is being processed by PIPC in an unlawful manner, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority, i.e. the President of the Personal Data Protection Office.

Do we profile your personal data, or do we automatically make decisions instead of you?

PIPC does not apply profiling or automated individual decision-making.

(b) fulfilling the legal obligations of the Chamber, in particular those imposed on PIPC as an employer organisation (the basis for processing of your personal data in this case will be Article 6(1)(c) of GDPR);

(c) achieving the objectives resulting from the legitimate interests of PIPC (the basis for processing of your personal data in this case will be Article 6(1)(f) of GDPR), i.e.:

- a. prevention of fraud;
- b. statistical purposes;
- c. determination, investigation or defence against claims; and
- d. ensure accountability (demonstrating PIPC's compliance with the legal provisions).

In the absence of other indications, your personal data will be processed based on your voluntary consent. The basis for the processing of your personal data in this case will be Article 6(1)(a) of GDPR. In case of data processing based on your consent, you may withdraw it at any time.
